We will be making plans to stop this happening again in the future and work will be carried out in the Autumn as not do disrupt the main golfing season.



We are aware the greens are no where near up to their usually standard. This Is always a difficult time of year as we start to see some grasses performing better than others as we come out of Winter. However as we start to see warmer temperatures the greens will naturally thicken out. In the mean time we are doing everything we can to try and get them as smooth as possible. They are being cut nearly everyday as well as being rolled on the days they are not cut. Remember the greens are alive and it's not an overnight fix.

The trench that has been dug by the current 9th tee is for the irrigation to the new 9th tee. This will be filled in as soon as possible, but in the meantime, please do no jump over it. Instead, leave your trolleys at the end and take your club back to the tee (and a spare ball if you think you'll need it).

New hole cups and ferruls (ends of pin) are on their way and should be out end of this week.
