


Winners of the **Christmas** Am-Am

Unfortunately, December has brought course closures. Consistent hard frosts with no thaw during the day meant a build up not only to the surface but deep into the ground. We then went to mild conditions very quickly which caused a rapid thaw. A further 8mm of rain on top resulted in saturated greens, as the water struggled to drain through the frost layer deep into the ground.

If we allowed play to carry on, the soft surface has a lot of movement so with every footprint it will compress, move with the momentum of your walk and as the ground below is still hard or frozen it will cause the roots to shear as they are anchored to the frozen layer. Compressing the surface with footfall will only compress the ground further and restrict space for air that's needed to keep the grass alive! Roots live in air so the more space you take away the harder the plant has to work. At he moment, this space is being taken up by water and we need to allow time for it percolate through the soil.

They have now firmed up enough to allow play and we will monitor them closely. Please be patient during the winter months as we do not know what the weather will bring.

We have finally taken delivery of the new greens mower, which we have unfortunately not been able to use yet for obvious reasons.

We wish you all a Happy Christmas and we hope the new year isn't as challenging as this one.
