

The Committee

Please remember to get your qualifying rounds played to allow you to be eligible for cup competitions next season. The minimum is 4 qualifying competitions either Medal or Stableford at Ryston. If you are unsure as to how many you have played contact the office on <u>ryston1933@gmail.com</u>. Exemptions can be applied at the discretion of the Committee. If you need to be considered for exemption, please apply in writing via the office.

Next season the Men's Club Championship will be 36 holes played over two consecutive Sundays (9th July & 16th July). There will be a cut after the first round of the top 20 players in both scratch & handicap. Food will be available on both days.

The date for the AGM has been set for Wednesday 15th February at 7pm. Nomination forms for any vacant positions on the Committee will be on the main Notice Board and need to be handed to the Secretary before 1st February 2023.

Greenstaff – Peter & Tiff

Not a lot to report this month apart from the obvious. Due to the relentless rain over the last few weeks the course is becoming wet. You will now start to notice hoops and rope out to guide you around the course to keep you off areas that receive the most wear and protect certain areas. Please try to avoid hugging the hoops and rope to help try spread the wear as much as possible. Buggy users – it is now very important to avoid certain areas and stick to the rough as much as possible. It will be monitored closely to see

how much damage is being caused.

The plastic rings in the holes are there to prevent the holes collapsing now the greens have become softer. Please **DO NOT** retrieve your ball out of the hole using the flagstick or your putter. This will cause the ring to lift or come out and then will not be at the correct depth for the group behind (or you on your back 9).

The club has very recently purchased a new hole changer due to the old one being worn.

Greens will be spiked next week to help with the recent rainfall to try keep them firm.



The forecast is looking very cold over the next couple of weeks so height of cut on the greens will be raised to winter height of 5mm to help protect them during the frosts and cutting will be reduced.

Winter tees are now in operation and we ask that players only use the white tees if playing in a Competition. These tees are smaller and won't recover during the Winter months.
