Well here we are approaching Christmas once again - where has the year gone?


Our Winter League team has started well with a home win against King's Lynn and an away half against Thetford - well done to everyone who played and especially to Pat who organised the matches.

The Summer seems a distant memory as heavy frosts have hit the course this week. Although we try to avoid closing the course for frosts, we need day time temperatures to be warm enough to thaw the overnight frost. Otherwise with the next frost it will only build and go deeper into the ground, which will then cause problems when the ground eventually thaws and when the damage is done. We obviously don't have a crystal ball so it's a case of monitoring the ground conditions on a daily basis and making the right judgement call for the course and club.

The new double practice net is slowly being built. The base now needs to be concreted, but with the heavy frosts at the moment it's not ideal conditions to do so. Please bare with us as we manage our time on this job as well as on the course. The practice ground is only 100yards away if you need to hit a few balls before starting

With course conditions changing more often during the Winter, the website can be the easiest way to keep up to date. We now have access to change the course status on the website which means we can keep you informed more easily and quickly, especially at the weekends when it's not fair on the office staff to send an email at 6.30/7am in the morning.

Leaf collecting is still our main focus at the moment, although we can hopefully now see the end in sight.

The club have purchased new rake handles for all the rakes in the bunkers. We will start to replace these soon and add some more to the larger bunkers.

We cannot stress how much we need everyone to repair their Pitchmarks. These are not only unsightly but will of course effect the smoothness of the green and with very little recovery now, will only become worse throughout the Winter.
