October has been the wettest month of the year with 178mm! 119mm has fallen in the last 2 weeks! Although the course is coping at the moment, this amount of rainfall before winter is not ideal as the course will struggle to dry out now we have shorter days and cooler temperatures, plus what extra will will get on top. So our routine maintenance is proving challenging as we still have growth and the leaves are now starting to drop! It's now a case of weighing up the options for the best results and what to do for the good. It may be that areas are left longer or the leaves won't be blown as we don't want to create unnecessary damage while we are having this wet spell.

So now more than ever we ask that golf course etiquette is adhered to. This includes, REPAIR PITCHMARKERS, REPLACE DIVOTS, RAKE BUNKERS, FOLLOW ROPES/HOOPS.

Buggy users please be sensible and avoid going close to the greens.

But it's not all doom and gloom, we are already thinking of next year! The new tee has been turfed and irrigation installed. This will now root in over the winter and will be in play early next year.

The few roles of turf remaining has been used to tidy up the bunker on the 4^{th} . This will be out of play until the turf roots.







Growth on the greens is starting to slow down and we will be increasing to winter height very soon. With all the rain and frequent footfall, we need to protect them from the wear they are going to receive. Aeration will also be frequent.



The new drain installed on the 9th green has really been put to the test this month. Although it has not totally cured the problem, there is an improvement and water is being removed from the green.
